Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy
<p>This module uses a combination of lectures, seminars and directed reading to analyse theoretical, empirical and policy related issues in the context of economic growth (LO's 1, 2, 4,5). Understanding and skills are further developed through a combination of practical/tutorial exercises including data gathering and analysis (LO's 3, 7) (formative assessment) and a module assignment (summative assessment) (LO 6).</p> <p>Formative assessment is through a combination of practical/tutorial exercises including data gathering and analysis, and through feedback on draft outlines of the individual research assignment. Summative assessment will consist of:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Three exercises not exceeding 500 words, to assess LO 1 and 2</li> <li>2. A research assignment, 2400-2600 words, to assess all LOs</li> </ol> <p>Supplementary assessment, if required, will be to revise and expand the research assignment to 3500-4000 words.</p>
