Module Aims
The aim of the module is to explore the properties and uses of sound production and related theoretical perspectives in order to evaluate a subject related to sound and produce a soundscape audio project.

Outline Syllabus
The syllabus explores the development of sound recording and the effect of changing technologies within the film, broadcasting and the music industries; sound and the moving image; music on film; radio: programming and audience. The module includes a practical element which includes audio software and sound acquisition.
